*The Family and Children's Services Division (FCSD) is one of three divisions of the Santa Clara County Mental Health Department.

The FCSD serves families and children who are experiencing extreme emotional distress. Services available include:

- ® Outpatient assessment and treatment
- ® School-based and classroom-based mental health services and consultation
- ® School-based and residential day treatment
- ® Emergency evaluation

- ® Psychiatric hospitalization
- ® Case management

Services are provided by 5 county and 17 contract agency programs.

Through our system of care, culturally competent programs are available to meet the needs of Hispanic, Asian, African American and American Indian youth and families. A primary objective of the Division is to address children and family mental health problems in the least restrictive, most family-like context possible. We seek to provide services which acknowledge and respect the unique cultural values of our clients, regardless of sexual orientation, and which support the clients natural support system and community of tie.



Primary Objective:

Address children and family mental health problems in the least restrictive most family-like context possible.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Every effort is made by FCSD to ensure that children and families most in need receive services. In addition, the Division is mandated to serve those youth entitled under AB3632/Ch.26.5 Government Code. (Special Education Emotionally Disturbed ED).

Youth who are seen in emergency rooms for psychiatric crisis; those who are recently released from psychiatric hospitals; those who are presenting bizarre, assaultive or self-injurious behavior, those ethnic youth experiencing severe adjustment at home or school due to stresses of acculturation; and those who are in or at risk of being placed in out-of-home care, have greatest priority for services.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Outpatient and school-based services are provided by both county and contract agencies in all regions of the county. Day treatment services are provided in several elementary schools or clinic settings.

Mental Health providers coordinate services offered in cooperation with the Social Services Agency, Juvenile Probation Department and Special Education (AB3632).



Outpatient and school-based services are provided.

INTENSIVE SERVICES PROGRAM

Intensive Services include liaison to emergency and hospital services, services provided to institutionalized youth in the Children's Shelter and Juvenile Hall, to youth in residential group homes and to youth receiving intensive case management services. This section also includes the multi-agency, Resources and Intensive Services Committee (RISC), which review requests for and monitors youth placed in the intensive residential care system. Wraparound services are provided to court wards, dependents, and AB 3632 ED youth at risk of/or returning from out-of-home placement

CHILDREN'S SYSTEM OF CARE

Santa Clara County is a Children's System of Care County (SB1667). Intensive Wraparound services are provided to Medi-Cal eligible court wards and dependents. The goals of service are to reduce out-of-home placements, maintain family and foster care stability, and eliminate return to the Children's Shelter, Juvenile Hall, or psychiatric hospitalization.
