**WHEREAS**, Doug Engelbart has authored over 25 publications, earned more than 20 patents, and received many honors, including the IEEE Computer Pioneer Award (1992); the Lemelson-MIT Prize (1997); and the National Medal of Technology in 2000; and

**WHEREAS**, Doug Engelbart has made significant contributions to the advancement of the high technology industry, the community, and humankind.
