The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is phasing out home and garden uses of two popular pesticides, Dursban and diazinon. Dursban is a trade name for the active pesticide ingredient, chlorpyrifos.

- Dursban or diazinon use may create health risks for the person applying the chemical, vulnerable young children and pets
- Exposure to Dursban or diazinon may affect children's nervous system development
- Dursban and diazinon are found in "weed and feed" lawn care products, pet flea collars, ant and roach killers and many other pesticide products

WHAT TO DO TO PROTECT YOUR FAMILY:

- Check pesticide product labels to identify those containing Dursban (chlorpyrifos) or diazinon
- Remove all products containing Dursban (chlorpyrifos) and diazinon from your home
- Drop-off Dursban and diazinon at the County of Santa Clara Household Hazardous Waste Program disposal sites
- Use non-toxic or less-toxic alternatives to these pesticides
