

Compatibility Testing

The **Roads and Airports Department** tests the web pages, videos, audios, images, photos or other pictorial and graphical material used on its website for the following minimum system requirements — often, the POP-UP blocker must be disabled:

- IBM-PC-compatible computer
- Microsoft's Windows XP (32-bit) with Service Pack 3 and all incremental updates
- SUN Microsystems' Java Runtime Environment (JRE) v.4.2
- Mozilla's FireFox v.3.x for Windows web browser
- Microsoft's Internet Explorer v.7 and v.8 web browser
- Adobe's Acrobat Reader v.7 for Windows — PDF file reader
- Microsoft's Windows Media Player v.11.

Not tested for compatibility with

- Any version of Microsoft's operating systems preceding Windows XP; or XP (64-bit), VISTA or Windows-7 operating systems.
- Opera, Safari, Chrome or other web browser, other than IE and FireFox
- Any non-IBM-PC-compatible computer, including Apple's Macintosh
- Any software designed to run on Apple or other non-IBM-PC-compatible computers, including any flavor of UNIX or Linux, or any Apple Operating System, or the Safari browser.

Users of earlier versions, or of other computers or operating systems, browsers and media players might experience difficulty when listening to audios or viewing web pages, videos, images, photos or other pictorial and graphical material.
