ACESConnection	<p><i>Develop an ACESConnection within Santa Clara County. ACEs Connection is a network that accelerates the global movement toward recognizing the impact of adverse childhood experiences in shaping adult behavior and health, and reforming all communities and institutions -- from schools to prisons to hospitals and churches -- to help heal and develop resilience rather than to continue to traumatize already traumatized people.</i></p> <p><i>The initiative brings a cross-sector group together to catalyze the community's efforts to prevent ACEs, heal trauma, and build resilience. Cross-sector includes education, human services, juvenile justice, mental health, civic, faith-based, business, etc. Everyone is committed to integrating ACE-, trauma-informed and resilience-building policies and practices into all parts of their organizations and communities.
