What's Open Under the State or Local Health Orders?

On August 28th, 2020, the State released its [Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#) ("Blueprint"), which created a tiered system of COVID-19 restrictions that all counties in California must follow. Santa Clara County is currently in Red Risk Tier (Tier Two).

The chart below shows what businesses and activities can resume under Red Risk Tier and under the local Risk Reduction Order. *Where the requirements applicable to businesses are different, businesses must follow the stricter of the two.*

Business or Activity	State's Red Risk Tier (with County Health Order Requirements)
Critical infrastructure sectors	Open (and follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
Limited-contact services (e.g. watch repair, tailors)	Open (and follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
Personal care services businesses	Open for outdoor operations (except for specific services not allowed outdoors, as listed here). In addition, follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here .
	Open for indoor operations. Services requiring removal of a face covering not allowed indoors, as listed here .
Retail stores	Open at 50% capacity (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
Shopping malls	Open at 50% capacity, but common areas must remain closed (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
	Food courts closed for indoor dining (picking up food to eat outdoors or take home is allowed).
Museums, zoos, aquariums	Open indoors at 25% capacity (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
Places of worship	Open outdoors with up to 60 people (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here).
	Open indoors for individual worship, but indoor gatherings are not allowed, as explained here.
Movie theaters	Open outdoors (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
	Indoor theaters are closed.
Hotels and lodging	Open (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here).
Gyms and fitness centers	Open outdoors (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here).
	Open indoors at 10% capacity except activities or classes that involve cardio/aerobic exercise. (For allowed indoor operations, follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here .)
Restaurants	Open for pick-up, drive-through, delivery, and outdoor dining (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here).
	Indoor dining is closed.
Wineries	Open outdoors (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here).
Bars and breweries	Closed outdoors unless meal is provided. Closed indoors.
Family entertainment centers	Open outdoors (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
	Closed indoors.
Cardrooms	Open outdoors (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
	Closed indoors.
Offices for non-critical-infrastructure sectors	Open for remote work (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
Professional sports	Open for training and competition without live audiences, if County Health Officer approves a facility-specific risk reduction protocol (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here).
Gatherings	Under State Order, not allowed except worship services; cultural ceremonies like wedding ceremonies (but not wedding receptions, parties, or celebrations) and funerals; and protests or political activities.
	Under County Health Order, gatherings allowed outdoors with up to 60 people (follow all County Health Officer Order requirements listed here and here). No indoor gatherings are allowed, as explained here.
