Prior to the February 12, 2019 Board of Supervisors meeting, please send letters to the five Supervisors in support of the Office of Labor Standards Enforcement (OLSE) request to:

- Expand their scope of enforcement to include judgments relative to sexual assault, sexual harassment, retaliation and human and labor trafficking.
- Expand their budget for their outreach and education program by \$500,000, totaling \$1,000,000.

If the Board passes these measures, the County will DOUBLE its impact and the following will be accomplished:

- In one year of implementation, the OLSE and partners will
 - Reach 1,315 Retail Food Businesses and 5,000 Retail Food Workers and Vulnerable Workers;
 - Provide Workers' Rights Training in all five Supervisorial Districts in five languages (English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Tagalog, and Chinese);
 - Inform vulnerable workers about their rights relative to:

Wage and Hour Law

Immigrant Workers' Rights

LGBTQ+ Workplace Protections

Retaliation

Sexual Harassment and Assault

Human and Labor Trafficking

Resources and Referral mechanisms
