County Coronavirus Dashboards Update

As of Wednesday, there were 8,321 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the County and 180 deaths. There are currently 169 people hospitalized in the County who are confirmed to have COVID-19. So far, 321,446 people in Santa Clara County have been tested, with an average 4% positive rate over the past seven days. The [dashboards](#) are updated daily.

A new [Cost Tracking Dashboard](#), which I requested with Supervisor Susan Ellenberg, shows that the COVID-19 pandemic has cost the County \$207 million, so far. There is a breakdown of cost by day, by agency or department, by vendor and by category.

Statewide, there were 413,576 cases, and 7,870 deaths; 6.6 million have been tested, with an average 7.4% positive rate over the past 14 days. For more statewide data, click [here](#).

In the U.S., there are 4 million cases, with 145,384 deaths.

Globally, there are 15 million cases and 623,897 deaths.

Pop-up Testing Locations Open This Week

The pop-up testing program operated by Santa Clara Valley Medical Center continues to provide free diagnostic COVID-19 testing around the County. Nasal swab testing is free for everyone—no health insurance or doctor's note is required. For most of the sites, no appointment is needed; anyone can simply stop by to get tested. Residents can find a testing location across the County at [sccfreetest.org](https://www.sccfreetest.org) or by calling 2-1-1.

- **San Jose High School**, 275 North 24th Street, San Jose: 1 to 6 p.m. through July 24, and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on July 25.
