SANTA CLARA COUNTY POLLS OPEN FOR JUNE 7, 2016 PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION

SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIF. – All 804 polling places in Santa Clara County are now open to eligible voters for the June 7, 2016 Presidential Primary Election. The 804 polling places, as well as the polls located at the Registrar of Voters' Office, will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. today.

Voters who received ballots by mail may drop off their ballots at any Polling Place, Ballot Drop-Off Site or the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters' Office prior to 8 p.m. tonight. A complete list of ballot drop-off locations and hours was included with the Vote by Mail ballot and may be found on the Registrar of Voters' website at [June 7 Presidential Primary Election Ballot Drop-Off Sites](#).

Vote by Mail ballots that are returned by mail must be postmarked on or before Election Day and must be received by Friday, June 10 (three days after the election). No postage is required to return ballots by mail.

Voters may locate their polling places by checking the back of their Sample Ballot and Voter Information Pamphlet, by visiting the Registrar of Voters' website at sccvote.org, by using the free [SCCVOTE mobile app](#) (which is available for download on Android and Apple devices) or by calling 1-866-430-VOTE (8683).

Election materials and bilingual assistance are available in Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, or Vietnamese. Call 1-408-299-8683 (VOTE) for assistance.

June 7, 2016 Presidential Primary Election

The June 7, 2016 Presidential Primary Election includes contests to determine the Presidential Candidates who will appear on the ballot in the General Election, which will be held on November 8, 2016.

The Primary Election also includes contests for seats in the U.S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives, California State Senate, California State Assembly, Santa Clara County Central



Committee(s), Morgan Hill Unified School District, Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors, and San Jose City Council.

Additionally, the June 7, 2016 Presidential Primary Election will present statewide and local questions to voters including taxation and bond measures. Measures regarding the regulation of medical marijuana collectives and the protection of the San Francisco Bay will also appear on the ballot.

Election Night Results and Information

Election results will be available at sccvote.org. The first results with preliminary Vote by Mail ballot tallies and Early Voting ballot tallies will be issued online at approximately 8:05 p.m.

The Registrar of Voters’ Office will post updated polling place results on its website at [Election Results](#) and on its [Twitter](#) and [Facebook](#) pages at approximate intervals of 45 minutes until all precincts have reported. Using previous presidential primary elections as a benchmark, all precincts may not report until the early morning hours of June 8.

The Registrar of Voters’ Office will process and tally Vote by Mail ballots for 24 hours a day until all Vote by Mail ballots that were received by Election Day have been counted. The Registrar of Voters’ Office will post updated results on its website at [Election Results](#) and on its [Twitter](#) and [Facebook](#) pages twice daily, at 9 a.m. and at 5 p.m., during the Canvass period.

“No Party Preference” Voters

Voters who registered with “No Party Preference” may exchange their ballot for any of the crossover party ballots at the Registrar of Voters’ Office, or at their assigned polling place. Requesting a “crossover” ballot does not change voters’ “No Party Preference” affiliation, but does allow voters to vote for the presidential candidate listed on the party ballot chosen for this election. Voters who registered with “No Party Preference” can vote in the Presidential primary for the following parties:

- Democratic
- American Independent
- Libertarian

Approximately three months before the election, the Registrar of Voters’ Office mailed over 150,000 postcards to “No Party Preference” voters informing them that they can “crossover” vote in this manner.

Vote by Mail Ballots and Drop-Off Sites:

In order for Vote by Mail ballots to be counted, voters must sign the return envelope themselves so that their signature on the envelope can be compared to their signature on the voter registration form and their identity can be confirmed. Voters who forgot to sign their return envelope must return the [Unsigned Ballot Statement](#) form located on our website by the eighth day after the election in order for their ballots to be counted.
