SANTA CLARA COUNTY POLLS OPEN FOR NOVEMBER 3, 2015 CONSOLIDATED ELECTION

SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIF. – All 25 polling places in the City of Los Altos, Orchard School District and Union School District are now open to eligible voters for the November 3, 2015 Consolidated Election. The [25 polling places](#), as well as the polls located at the Registrar of Voters' Office, will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. today.

Voters who received ballots by mail may drop off their ballots at any Polling Place, Ballot Drop-Off Site or the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters' Office prior to 8 p.m. tonight. A complete list of ballot drop-off locations and hours was included in the Vote by Mail ballot packet and may be found on the Registrar of Voters' website at [November 3, 2015 Consolidated Election Ballot Drop-Off Sites](#).

Vote by Mail ballots that are returned by mail must be postmarked on or before Election Day and must be received by Friday, November 6 (three days after the election). No postage is required to return ballots by mail.

Voters may locate their polling places by checking the back of their Sample Ballot and Voter Information Pamphlet, by visiting the Registrar of Voters' website at sccvote.org, by using the free [SCCVOTE mobile app](#) (which is available for download on Android and Apple devices) or by calling 1-866-430-VOTE (8683).

Election materials and bilingual assistance are available in Chinese, Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog, or Vietnamese. Call 1-408-299-8683 (VOTE) for assistance.

The Registrar of Voters' Office will post updated results at approximate intervals of 45 minutes and will continue updating its results page until all polling place ballots have been counted. The first Vote by Mail tallies will be posted at approximately 8:05 p.m.

Voters who drop off their completed Vote by Mail ballots must remember to sign their return envelope, as their signature must be compared to their voter registration form to confirm their identity.

November 3, 2015 Consolidated Election

The November 3, 2015 Consolidated Election includes a contest for a seat on the Board of Orchard School District, a renewal of an expiring parcel tax measure for Union School District and a bond measure for the City of Los Altos.

Orchard School District consists of 4,298 registered voters. Union School District consists of 21,949 registered voters and the City of Los Altos consists of 17,838 registered voters.

Only registered voters who live in the City of Los Altos and Orchard or Union School Districts are eligible to participate in the election. Voters who want to find out if they live within these jurisdictions can look up their districts using the online tool [Look Up Your Districts](#).
