TODAY IS THE LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE FOR APRIL ELECTION IN SAN JOSE COUNCIL DISTRICT 4 *Online Registration Until Midnight*

SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIF. – Today is the last day to register to vote in the April 7th Special Election in San Jose Council District 4.

“Registering to vote is one of our most fundamental rights as citizens,” said Registrar of Voters Shannon Bushey. “The Registrar’s Office is here to answer your questions and make sure you’re ready to make your voice heard on Election Day.”

Registration can be done online at [Register to Vote](#). Voters who would like to check their registration status may do so on the website at [Check Your Registration Status](#).

Voters should complete a new registration form if they have moved, changed their name, or would like to change their political party preference. To register to vote in Santa Clara County, a voter must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old, a Santa Clara County resident, and not in prison or on parole for a felony.

Online registrations will be accepted as long as they are completed before midnight tonight, paper registration forms that are postmarked today will also be accepted. Paper registration forms are available at post offices, public libraries, fire stations, city halls, and most local government offices.

Register to Vote Online

Voters can access the California Online Voter Registration system at registertovote.ca.gov. The system will use the voter’s DMV signature from their California driver’s license or identification card to complete the process online. Voters can also print their registration forms to sign and return by mail. Online registrations will be accepted as meeting today’s deadline as long as they are completed before midnight.

San Jose Council District 4 Special Election

The April 7th Election includes a single contest to decide who will fill a vacancy on the San Jose City Council for District 4. Only registered voters who live in San Jose City Council District 4 are eligible to participate in the election. Voters wishing to find out if they live in San Jose Council District 4 can look up their districts using the online tool at [Look Up Your Districts](#).



Vote by Mail voters account for approximately 69% of the 40,370 voters in San Jose City Council District 4 and were previously mailed ballots on March 9th.

Vote by mail voters who prefer to cast their ballots in person can also vote early at the Registrar of Voters' office. Voters who wish to vote by mail can mail their ballots, drop off ballots at one of our ballot drop off sites in their neighborhoods, visit one of the 26 polling places on Election Day, or even drive thru a weekend ballot drop off site.

"It is important for voters to participate in these local special elections because one vote can make a lot of difference," said Registrar of Voters Shannon Bushey.

Sample ballot pamphlets mailed the week of February 26th included an application to request a vote by mail ballot. Vote by Mail ballots may be requested by completing that application, applying on the website [Request a Vote by Mail Ballot](#), or calling us at 1-408-299-VOTE (8683) or toll free 1-866-430-VOTE (8683). The last day to request a ballot by mail is Monday, April 1st.

Returning Vote by Mail Ballots

Vote by Mail ballots that are returned in-person must be received by 8 p.m. on Election Day, April 7th. Vote by Mail ballots returned by mail must be postmarked on or before Election Day and must be received by Friday, April 10th (three days after the election). Voters are encouraged to mail their ballots as soon as possible. Voters must sign the return envelope themselves so the signature can be compared to the voter registration form to confirm the voter's identity.

Vote by Mail ballots can be returned in-person at the Registrar's office, any Santa Clara County polling place on Election Day, or at a designated ballot drop-off site. A complete list of ballot drop-off locations and hours is included in the Vote by Mail ballot packet and online at [April 7th Special Election Ballot Drop-Off Sites](#). Voters can track the status of their ballots online at www.sccvote.org or by using the free SCCVOTE mobile app.

Early Voting is open to all registered voters in Santa Clara County. Any voter can vote early at the Registrar of Voters' Office 1555 Berger Drive, Building 2, San Jose, CA 95112
