## **WEEKEND VOTING OPTIONS OFFERED FOR MAY 5 SPECIAL ELECTION IN PALO ALTO UNIFIED AND CAMPBELL UNION SCHOOL DISTRICTS**

*Over 67,000 Ballots Outstanding in the Special Mail Ballot Elections*

**SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIF.** – The Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters will be offering early voting and operating convenient drive-thru ballot drop-off sites at the Campbell Library and Palo Alto City Hall during the next two Saturdays, April 25 and May 2.

Voting began nearly three weeks ago for the May 5 Special Election as the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters mailed close to 86,000 ballots to voters in the Palo Alto Unified and Campbell Union School Districts for the special mail ballot election on May 5. Over 67,000 of those ballots are still outstanding.

Because this is an all-mail ballot election, there will be no polling places on Election Day. Instead, all registered voters in the districts were automatically sent a ballot, including their Sample Ballot and Voter Information Pamphlet, on April 6. No postage is required to return a ballot in a mail ballot election.

“We are encouraging voters to visit County drive-thru ballot drop-off sites, return their ballot at one of the ballot drop-off locations or come to our office the next two Saturdays to vote or drop off their ballots,” said Registrar of Voters, Shannon Bushey.

Voters who prefer to cast their ballots in person can vote early at the Registrar of Voters’ office. The Registrar’s office will be open for early voting the next two Saturdays, April 25 and May 2, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Early Voting is also available during normal business hours, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Voters can mail their ballots, drop off ballots at a ballot drop off site in their neighborhood, or drive thru a weekend ballot drop off site. The drop-off sites will also be available again next Saturday, May 2.

### **Returning Ballots**

Ballots can be returned by mail using the purple postage-paid return envelope included in the ballot packet. Voters are encouraged to return their ballots as soon as possible to allow enough time for them to be received by Election Day. Ballots that are returned in-person must be received



by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 5. Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked on or before Election Day and must be received by Friday, May 8 (three days after the election).

For added convenience, the Registrar's Office has ballot drop boxes at city halls and the Campbell Library, available during normal business hours. There is also a drop box inside the County Government Center at 70 West Hedding Street and a 24-hour drop box in the parking lot of the Registrar of Voters' Office at 1555 Berger Drive in San Jose.

Additionally, staff from the Registrar's Office will set up drive-thru ballot drop-off sites at the Campbell Library and Palo Alto City Hall this Saturday, April 25, and Saturday, May 2, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Voters can cast a ballot in-person at the Registrar's Office during normal business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Saturdays (April 25 & May 2) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., and on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

**Early Voting** is open to all registered voters in Santa Clara County. Any voter can vote early at the Registrar of Voters' Office **1555 Berger Drive, Building 2, San Jose, CA 95112.**

## **Palo Alto Unified School District and Campbell Union School District Special Election**

The May 5 Election for both the Palo Alto Unified School District and the Campbell Union School District, each contain a single contest - a parcel tax measure. Only registered voters who live in these districts are eligible to participate in the election.

Special mail ballot elections have become common in Santa Clara County; there have been ten held in the last five years. Mail ballot elections typically have voter turnout rates in the 35-45% range. The turnout tends to be higher than most other local special elections but lower than countywide primary or general elections. Palo Alto Unified School District consists of 42,072 registered voters and the Campbell Union School District consists of 43,841 registered voters.

The last day to register to vote in the election was April 20 and could be done online at [Register to Vote](#). Voters can check their registration status on the website at [Check Your Registration Status](#).
