Program Overview

In 2006, Santa Clara County established the MVDR program as a federally recognized Medical Reserve Corps Unit. The MVDR program abides by federal rules to support their community by providing a variety of emergency medical resources. The MVDR cadre consists of over 400 registered members ranging in scope of practice: Registered Nurses, Physicians, Social Workers, Paramedics, EMT's, First Responders, and more...
Our strength comes from our diversity.

Mission

The mission of the MVDR is to establish teams of local volunteer medical and public health professionals who can contribute their skills and expertise throughout the year and during times of community need.

The MVDR mission aligns with the National Medical Reserve Corps basic goal of improving the capacity of existing units to meet local emergency preparedness and response needs.

Purpose

The purpose of the MVDR is to promote medical health and safety in three key areas:

1. Strengthen emergency response and community resiliency: MVDR is available to supplement existing emergency response resources.
2. Mass Casualty Incidents: Emergency medical response for disasters that cause injury or threats to large numbers of people.
3. Community Outreach: Support medical health initiatives, such as health fairs, influenza immunization clinics, or training events.

What We Offer

Members of the MVDR will have the opportunity to participate in training and exercises designed to strengthen individual skill sets while satisfying the Medical Reserve Corps core competencies.

As a volunteer you will be issued a full BDU response uniform, a MVDR polo shirt, and personal protective equipment.

Many of the free training and exercises are eligible for continuing education units which will be made available to all members at no cost.

Requirements

You must participate in a New Member Orientation after you apply and take the Disaster Service Workers Loyalty Oath.

Complete the Medical Reserve Corps Core Competencies by attending a minimum of three training scenarios and one exercise per year.

Take part in full-scale exercises, hands-on and classroom based training, and community outreach events throughout the year.
